
# ILLAH VAN OJEN PUNKT





In New Capital, Hannes adopts an unexplored perspective to highlight contradictions and critical issues about recent development operations that have reshaped big cities. # VISITING URBAN EXPLORER

The Visiting Urban Explorer format invites three young experts —for the first time in Turin— to freely explore the city. Their task is to propose ideas, insights, and suggestions for imagining new, possible urban solutions.

In 2024, the VUEs (this is the acronym) will all be photographers. They will explore Turin to capture, through their images, the phenomena, cultures, dynamics, and potential of the lesser-known areas in the city. At the end of their exploration, they will jump on stage to share the key findings from their time in the city.
